Book #1610 Training

Native Culture & Spirituality - (Trainer's Manuel Day 1 – 5)

This trainer's manual is based on a native and spirituality training module designed and developed in a participatory process. Twenty-one participants from fourteen Northwest Territories communities contributed to the module structure. Inclusive are three elders that guided the process as well as two facilitators. The first of two part module explores what is culture, the importance of Aboriginal traditional values and beliefs, traditional roles and spiritual relationships and cultural oppression. Although this module is intended for beginning Alcohol and Drug Program, it's content layout, handout information and it's recommendation to be taught 'on the land' may be useful in culture camp.

Book #1611 Training

Native Culture & Spirituality – (Trainer's Manuel Day 6 - 10)

This is a second part of native culture & spirituality module. This part links cultural values, Aboriginal life cycle in addiction recovery and explores personal empowerment in addiction recovery. Individual presentations and feast completes the last two days. Like the first part of the module, this trainer's manual may be used for culture camp however, if considered for use to enhance the culture camp, it is recommended as in the manual by the elders that a knowledgeable facilitator of traditional Aboriginal culture take on the task.

Most of the teachings come from experienced trappers and elders however, since farmers and trappers work closely with the land they both are viewed on equal footing.
