This discussion paper only for First Nations Circle is to involve everyone; elders, women, youth, off-reserve Aboriginals in discussion hearings on the constitution. It provides information on First Nations' relations with Canada now and then and what may be faced in the future. On the outset, the information reviews Aboriginal Rights, treaty rights, self-government, provincial separation and land claims followed by a set of questions in hopes to initiate serious discussions at the hearings. The reason is to develop a position that will truly reflect the Aboriginal peoples' vision for the future.
