Blondin, Georgina (1988) A CASE STUDY OF SUCCESSFUL INNOVATION

This paper submission is in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the degree of Master in Education by the late Georgina Blondin daughter of George Blondin. The paper is based on the Zhatie Koe (Fort Providence) Slavey Language Program in 1981. To defend her study, Georgina gives chronological historical events of change for the Dene people and describes the change in five phrases in education. The five phrases are as follows: Traditional Dene Education, Formal Education by Religious Education, Federal presence in Dene Education, Territorial and Public Education and the current initiatives and potential. She moves into explaining the initiatives, the people that supported the timely movement to build a Slavey Language Program.

This manual is a guide for instructors that want to start a Dene literacy program. It came about from a pilot project that was set up in Snowdrift now known as Lutselk'e. Volume 1 begins with the heading, working as a Group moves into setting project goals and developing project organization and ends with evaluating the teaching project. Each topic is accompanied by review checklist and helping materials. Volume 2 covers education principles, educational approaches and determining learning methodology. This is completed with review checklist and helping materials as well.

Stewart, Sarah (1992) THIS IS RAVEN'S LAND Gwich'in Culture and Language Curriculum for Grade One Students. Language Centre G.N.W.T. Delta Beaufort Board of Education.

This grade one curriculum takes the approach of capturing the true essences of traditional Gwich'in way of thinking reflective of the elders that experienced 'on the land' living and learning. Curriculum design, thematic units lesson plans and teaching activities are all explained and some places accompanied by samples and charts. The thematic units are on animals such as raven, fish, caribou, marten, wolf, wolverine, fox, rabbit, muskrat and bear.
