




Polytechnic University Facilities Master Plan

What is it?



A Facilities Master Plan (FMP) is a strategic document to guide an organization in their long-term development and maintenance of their facilities. An FMP is data-driven and provides a high-level view of what facilities are required to meet an organization's future needs.

Developing an FMP is common practice with governments and universities that have a variety of facilities in their portfolio.

The FMP process begins by analyzing existing facilities to identify the potential for enhancement or expansion, before proposing any changes to accommodate expanding needs or future growth.

The Facilities Master Plan will also provide a comprehensive picture of each facility type and

their connection to the broader network of facilities across the polytechnic university.

Aurora College currently operates three campuses, which includes the Thebacha Campus in Fort Smith, Aurora Campus in Inuvik, and the Yellowknife North Slave Campus. Aurora College also maintains a network of community learning centres and research facilities.

The FMP will present opportunities for the enhancement and expansion of teaching, research and student housing facilities.

Aurora College Transformation

- The transformation of Aurora College began in 2018, with the polytechnic university anticipated to launch in 2025.
- The enhancement and expansion of infrastructure will continue beyond the launch date.
