Field:	2 nd year students or later studying the following: Kinesiology, Physical Education, Recreation, Sport Administration, Business – Related to or a minor in Sport/Recreation, Indigenous Studies, Education surrounded around bettering the lives of Indigenous people.

Details:	The purpose of the ASCNWT Scholarship is to provide financial assistance to Indigenous NWT students who are pursuing a post-secondary education related to sport, recreation, culture or specifically surrounding Indigenous people.

Adolf Duesterhus Stem Scholarship Fund (2)

Provider:	Estate of Adolf Duesterhus
Field:	Science, Technology, Engineering, or Math (STEM)
Value:	\$5,000
Deadline:	May 15
Details:	<p>Support Yellowknife residents pursuing post-secondary studies in Science, Technology, Engineering, or Mathematics.</p> <p>Prerequisites applications for the scholarship are open to individuals who are a resident of Yellowknife for a minimum of two years. To be eligible, an individual must be registered to attend an accredited post-secondary institution and planning on returning to the North after studies are complete.</p>

Applicants must:

- Include a written essay of a maximum 500 words on:
 - The benefits they and the community they live in will obtain from the scholarship.
 - Their community involvement and contribution.
 - Willingness to be involved in promotional activities related to the scholarship.
 - How the scholarship will assist them in achieving their STEM-based goals.
- Include written confirmation of acceptance in a STEM program at an accredited post-secondary institution.
- Include information on the field of study being undertaken.
- Include one letter of reference from a teacher, STEM professional or community leader.
- A Proof of Residency form must be submitted along with the application.

The Andrew Goussaert Memorial Scholarship (5)

Provider:	Arctic Co-operatives Limited
Field:	Any
Value:	\$1,500 or \$1,000 paid annually over three years (Based on Co-op Affiliation)
Deadline:	May
Details:	<p>Andrew Goussaert dedicated his life to working alongside Indigenous communities to build the Arctic Co-operative network across the NWT and Nunavut. He supported Arctic peoples in the development of the strongest and most diverse group of Indigenous-owned businesses in Canada.</p> <p>Arctic Co-operatives will award scholarships up to five new recipients each year. Each student scholarship recipient will receive an annual payment for three years, as long as the student is actively enrolled in post-Secondary education/training in the current year and has communicated intent to register for courses in the upcoming year.</p>

Applicants must:

- Be affiliated (either live within or are from) with a community from the Arctic Co-ops network (please see website for more information).
- Complete high school education the same year they are applying for this scholarship.
- Must be enrolled (or have intent to enroll) in a post-Secondary program within the year of their application.

Value:	\$1,000/year
Deadline:	<p>If you progressed between January 1, 2019, and December 31, 2020, your deadline to submit an application is: 18 months following your date of progression.</p> <p>If you progressed on or after January 1, 2021, your deadline to submit an application is: 12 months following your date of progression.</p>
Details:	The Apprenticeship Incentive Grant (AIG) is a taxable cash grant of \$1,000/year, up to a maximum of \$2,000/person, available to registered apprentices once they have successfully finished their first or second year/level (or equivalent) of an apprenticeship program in one of the Red Seal trades.

Applicants must:

- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or protected person.
- Not be a high school student.
- Have the required AIG supporting documents.
- Register with your provincial/territorial apprenticeship authority as an apprentice in a designated Red Seal trade.
- Provide proof that you have successfully completed either the 1st and/or 2nd year level (or equivalent) in a designated Red Seal trade.

Value:	\$1,000/year
Deadline:	<p>If you progressed between January 1, 2019, and December 31, 2020, your deadline to submit an application is: 18 months following your date of progression.</p> <p>If you progressed between January 1, 2021, and March 30, 2022, your deadline to submit an application is: 12 months following your date of progression.</p> <p>If you progressed on or after March 31, 2022, your deadline to submit an application is: March 31, 2023. You should apply by this date, even if you have not received supporting documents from your apprenticeship authority.</p> <p>In all cases, the deadline for submitting supporting documents is 12 months from your application deadline.</p>
Details:	The Apprenticeship Incentive Grant for Women is a taxable cash grant of \$3,000 per year/level (or equivalent) up to a maximum amount of \$6,000 per person, available to registered apprentices once they have successfully finished their first or second year/level (or equivalent) of an apprenticeship program in one of the Red Seal trades.

Applicants must:

- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or protected person.
- Not be a high school student.
- Self-Identify as a woman.
- Have the required AIG-W supporting documents.
- Register with your provincial/territorial apprenticeship authority as an apprentice in a designated Red Seal trade having low female representation.
- Provide proof that you have successfully completed either the 1st and/or 2nd year level (or equivalent) in a designated Red Seal trade.

Details:	The Arthur Paulin Automotive Aftermarket Scholarship Awards program was established by members of the Automotive Industries Association of Canada (AIA) to provide monetary assistance to deserving students who wish to further their education in the automotive field. The Scholarship Awards were designed to promote professionalism within the automotive aftermarket, create awareness of the aftermarket industry and attract new people to the industry and advance the state of knowledge within the industry.

Applicants must:

- Be enrolled in an automotive aftermarket industry related program or curriculum at a Canadian college or university.
 - Includes students pursuing their studies as an automotive apprentice, along with any of the following automotive sectors: Auto Body, Hard Parts, Heavy Duty, or Motive Power (machinists).
- Provide a letter of intent which includes their long-term goals, past experience, and how this scholarship will positively impact them.
- Provide a letter of recommendation from their primary automotive instructor which discusses why the instructor feels the scholarship applicant is worthy of receiving the scholarship. This may include the applicant's academic achievements, natural ability, hard work, professionalism, teamwork, attention to detail, initiative, etc.
- Submit any applicable academic records (Transcripts, awards, etc.).
- Provide a brief outline of the applicant's demonstrated leadership and civic abilities.
- Provide an outline of financial considerations as they relate to the student's pursuit of their automotive studies. The applicant's degree of need should be clearly demonstrated.

Value:	\$1,000 per semester, up to a maximum of \$2,000 per school year.
Deadline:	August 1 – Fall Semester December 1 – Winter Semester April 1 – Spring/Summer Semester
Details:	This bursary helps NWT students (25 years and under) who are doing their post-secondary studies in French in a Canadian institution. These bursaries are administered by the Department of Education, Culture and Employment.

Applicants must:

- Be enrolled in a post-secondary French program in Canada.
- Pass a minimum of four courses that semester, three of which must be French.
- Have attended an NWT school for at least five years.
- Be an NWT high school graduate.

Bursaries for Post-Secondary Studies in French as a Second Language (Multiple)

Provider:	Association des Collèges et Universités de la Francophonie Canadienne
Field:	French
Value:	\$3,000
Deadline:	Varies between the affiliated post-secondary institutions
Details:	English-speaking Canadians enrolled in the first year of a college or university program have an opportunity to receive a \$3,000 bursary to perfect their bilingualism while studying in a field of interest. This yearly program was established by the Government of Canada. Its aim is to encourage young English-speaking students to pursue their postsecondary studies in French. The objective is simple: Allow a greater number of English-speaking Canadians to become bilingual.

Applicants must:

- Apply through their post-secondary institution (Refer to website below to see if the school you are attending is affiliated).
- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada.
- Study full-time in a Canadian institution during the current year and have completed their secondary school studies in an English-language institution and graduated from this institution.
- Be enrolled in the first year of a post-secondary study program in French.
- Be at least 17 years old on the first day of class.
- Demonstrate that they have sufficient knowledge of French to be able to study in that language.
- Intend to pursue full-time studies in a college or undergraduate University program in Canada, to take at least 50% of their courses and participate in related activities (placements and training activities in the community) in French.

Value:	\$2,000
Deadline:	August 31
Details:	Canada Post gives \$2,000 grants to Indigenous Peoples who have renewed their educational learning. This scholarship is available for students who have been out of school for 1 year or more and are returning or have already returned to school and completed 1 full year of studies.

Applicants must:

- Be Canadian and a member of a First Nation, Métis, or Inuit Community.
- Have been out of school for one year or more and are returning or have already returned to school and completed one full year of studies.
- Complete the application form and provide an essay based on the provided criteria.
- Provide school transcripts or a letter from an academic supporter (photocopies are acceptable).
- Include a photocopy of a community membership card or an official letter from a community member.
