Am I Eligible?

Employers must be:

- Licensed to operate in the Northwest Territories
- · Located in an eligible community
- In operation for at least 6 months
- In good standing with the Workers' Safety and Compensation Commission
- One of the following:
 - Business or Corporation
 - Aboriginal Government or Organization
 - Non-governmental Organization
 - Municipal or Local Government
 - Industry Association
 - Local Housing Authority
 - Educational Institution/Training Provider
 - Board/Agency

Trainees must be:

- At least 18 years of age
- Unemployed
- A resident of an eligible community

Financial Assistance

Financial assistance may include:

- Course costs
- Special supports for trainees with disabilities

Wage subsidies are available for a 12 - 52 week employment period.

Financial assistance is available only for fulltime positions (minimum of 30 hours per week).

Wage subsidies apply to regular hours worked by the trainee. All overtime, vacation, statutory holidays, sick and special leave is the responsibility of the employer.

Employers must contribute a minimum of 20% of the trainee's wage and pay at least minimum wage, including other benefits and dues found in the *Employment Standards Act*.
