



HOW WE WORK | CEAs AND STUDENTS

You don't have to know what you want to be when you "grow up."

Many students graduating have no idea where they want to go, and even if they do, it often changes a few times before they are in their first full-time job. The world of work is different today than it was in your parents' generation, and changing rapidly as we adapt to the global pandemic.

There are projections and research emerging that new occupations will be created to address new problems and opportunities.

This is where the Career and Education Advisors (CEAs) come in. They meet one-on-one with students to help them figure out who they are, where their interests lie, discover their strengths, and help define any goals they may have.

The CEAs use a number of tools and resources to guide students as they move through the process to determine the best available pathways for them. Some of these resources include working with myBlueprint, an online platform, as well as using a model designed to help the students find out about themselves and discover education and career options.

All advising sessions, usually three, are student-centered conversations based on the needs, goals and personality of the student.

For the summer of 2020, the CEAs are focused on helping Grade 12 students with the new processes and requirements for online learning for the fall.
